

San Francisco: Hotel Nikko turns 25 with a \$49 anniversary dinner

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Hotel Nikko opened 25 years ago at 222 Mason St. in San Francisco. Since then, the 532-room hotel says it has served about 5 million visitors.

To celebrate, it's offering a special meal at its in-house restaurant Anzu for the fixed price of \$49. The cost doesn't include wine, but it does include some of the eatery's best appetizers and entrees.

The deal: The five-course meal at Anzu starts with Ahi Blossom (spicy scallop, tuna, tobiko caviar) and end with a Fog (coffee and Irish cream cheesecake with creme Anglaise). The meal costs \$49 a person and an additional \$30 for those who want wine pairings with the courses.

Date: The offer is good through Nov. 30, except on Thanksgiving.

Details: A quick look at Anzu's usual menu shows the fixed-price anniversary meal to be a good deal. The ahi blossom usually goes for \$16, the corn-lobster chowder for \$8 and the wagyu beef onglet entrée for \$36 – and that's not counting the extra courses and \$8 dessert.
